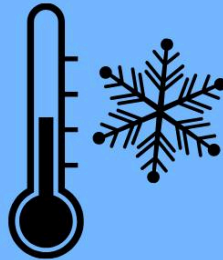

## Creating Housing Options for Veterans



Many of our veterans experience housing instability when transitioning from the armed forces to civilian life. However, through a joint partnership between my office, our Veterans' Services Office, American Legion Post 45, and Suffolk Construction, we're taking a major step toward creating a path toward meaningful housing options for our service-members by turning the Legion site into transitional housing with multiple units.

Suffolk Construction has generously agreed to fund a feasibility study for the development of this project at 321 Winthrop Street. Suffolk also agreed to fund \$15,000 worth of upgrades to the facility. This project was part of a Community Fund grant application, with the City funding the remaining \$10,000.

We recently toured the building to get a better sense of the project and plan out the next steps.

Thank you to Community Fund Committee member and Suffolk Construction staff member Erin Murphy Rafferty for helping coordinate this project with her team, Bobby Miller and the team at the American Legion, and our Veterans' Services Director Veronica Shaw, along with my office.

### Medford Receives “Distinguished Budget Presentation Award” for Fiscal Year 2026 Municipal Budget

The City has received its third “Distinguished Budget Presentation Award” from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for the Fiscal Year 2026 municipal budget, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The Finance and Communications departments compiled the application materials and submitted the FY26 budget for consideration in September 2025, and the GFOA awards were announced in December 2025. The City had previously won the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for its Fiscal Year 2021 and 2025 budgets.

### City Enters into Three Year Agreement with Ambulance Provider Cataldo Ambulance Service

The City of Medford has entered into a three-year contract agreement with ambulance provider Cataldo Ambulance Service. Cataldo will be providing all basic and advanced lifesaving ambulance emergency response coverage for the City beginning at 7 a.m. on January 19.

In addition to providing life and safety support, Cataldo will work in collaboration with the City to establish a Behavioral Support Unit to assist with mental health and substance use emergency calls. Cataldo will also provide 21 new Automated External Defibrillators to the Fire Department and six to the Medford Public Schools.

The latest retail location from the *Project: Pop-Up Medford* program, opened at 348 Boston Avenue near Tufts University on December 1, 2025. UpNext, Tufts University and the City of Medford are collaborating to support local entrepreneurs by providing access to retail space to test their business ventures and foster a vibrant retail district.

Participating entrepreneurs will have the opportunity to pilot their products in a brick-and-mortar setting in a rent-free space and have access to business development resources aimed at helping them succeed in a retail environment. 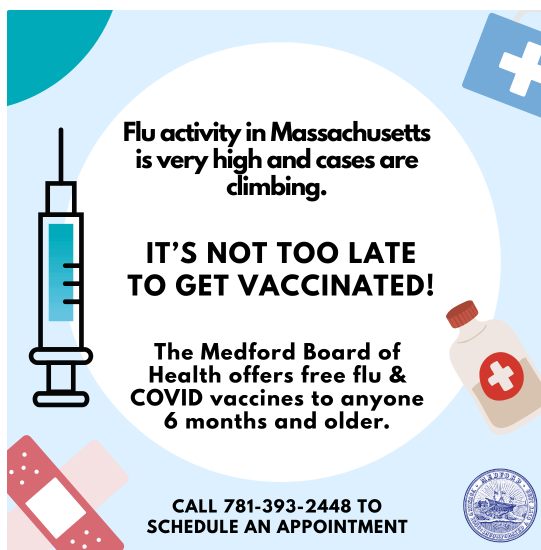

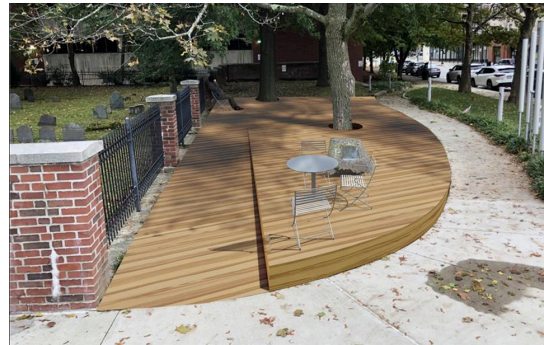


Flu activity in Massachusetts is very high and cases continue to climb. The Medford Board of Health offers free flu and COVID vaccines to anyone ages 6 months and older.

It's not too late to get vaccinated - call 781-393-2448 to schedule an appointment!

The Board of Health also offers homebound vaccines for residents who may have trouble leaving the house.

## Park Project Updates



- Construction is underway at **Logan Park**! The City is working with designer CBA and contractor Belko to install a natural play area next to the playground. Seating and play features will be made from 'found/natural materials' such as logs, stumps, and repurposed granite stone slabs. This project is funded with CPA funds.
- The City has awarded a contract to JJ Phelan and designer IMEG Corp to complete work at **Riverside Plaza** starting this April. The work will be finished by June 2026. The project involves installing a shade canopy, umbrellas, and a water fountain in the plaza area. A low, accessible deck will be installed under the existing mature trees to protect the tree roots and offer an accessible place to sit and take advantage of the shade in the summer. This project is made possible with PARC and CPA funding.
- Last year, a storm caused a tree branch to fall and damage a net climber at **Magoun Park**. A portion of the play equipment, safety surfacing, and footing will need to be replaced and tested prior to being safe to use again. The play piece has been marked off with caution tape - please help us keep everyone safe and refrain from using the climber until it has been fixed. The City is working on understanding the costs and scope of work in order to hire a contractor to perform the replacement work.

- The City was awarded a state earmark, with the support of Representative Christine Barber, to fund design services for **Tufts Playground**. More information will be shared soon about how you can get involved! ## Leaf Blower Ordinance Reminder

[Medford's leaf blower ordinance](#) limits the use of gas-powered leaf blowers to reduce noise and improve air quality. Electric and battery-powered blowers are allowed during designated hours. Gas-powered leaf blowers are not permitted for regular landscape maintenance, while electric and battery-powered blowers are allowed during designated hours.

Residents and contractors are encouraged to review the rules and use approved equipment.
