Continuing Snow Removal Efforts



We had a historic snowstorm recently and our DPW has been working around the clock to ensure our streets, sidewalks, parking lots, and pathways are safe and accessible.

Over the past few days, the DPW has completed snow removal operations on Winthrop Street, Medford Square, Haines Square, South Medford, West Medford Square and bus stops in Medford Heights, as well as working through resident concerns at intersection corners and widening streets.

As a reminder, snow removal/street widening has been ongoing since the storm ended. During a snowstorm crews focus on clearing main roads, side roads and sidewalks so they are passable. Once the storm is over, they then move on to:

- School parking lots
- School drop off areas
- City parking lots
- Other City buildings
- Business lots
- Intersection corners
- School bus stops
- MBTA bus stops

Reminder that shoveling sidewalks in front of homes and businesses is the responsibility of the property owner. Failing to clear the sidewalk in front of your property may result in a fine from the City. Also, please note that parking space savers are prohibited on public ways in Medford and the DPW will be removing items as they see them.

## Statement on Recent ICE Operations

With the help of the MAPC, Cambridge City Manager Yi-An Huang and I released the below statement as Co-Chairs of the Metro Mayors Coalition:

The Metro Mayors Coalition decries the ICE occupation of Minneapolis and Portland. This is not a targeted immigration enforcement action, but instead resembles a militarized invasion of masked and armed federal agents intended to create fear and intimidation.

ICE is racially profiling our communities, detaining legal residents and U.S. citizens, and using excessive force against civilians. Two U.S. citizens have been killed and many more have been injured. Parents are keeping their children home from school, worshippers are staying home from their religious community, and families are missing doctor's appointments and work for fear of being forcibly taken. Community trust is breaking and public safety is being jeopardized. These unconstitutional and unnecessary actions increase tensions and make us less safe.

An occupying force does not belong in our communities or anywhere in the United States of America. We demand an immediate end to ICE actions and call for full respect for the Constitution, civil liberties, and public safety.

Free Trees from TreesMedford



# Free Tree

TreesMedford (a local nonprofit) is once again providing free trees for the hottest areas of Medford. Free trees are available to residents in areas south of Salem St. and the Mystic River including Hillside, Glenwood, South Medford, and Wellington. This year TreesMedford is opening the process to enable people in **all neighborhoods** to get a tree and planting supplies from us at wholesale cost (\$150).

The 7-10' high saplings of native shade trees varieties will have a good head start on growing into a healthy tree in your yard. Best selection if ordered by **March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026**.

If you want a tree for the grass strip in front of your home, or want the City of Medford to plant a tree for you in your yard near the sidewalk, contact the [City of Medford tree warden](#) and go to [See Click Fix](#) to request a tree.

TreesMedford is once again providing free trees for the hottest areas of Medford this spring!

You are eligible if:

1. If you are a renter, you have your landlord's permission.
2. You will place the tree on your property, and not on the grass strip by the road. (The City of Medford provides trees for the grass strip.)
3. You agree to water the tree consistently during dry periods (at least 12 gallons/week)
4. You have the space and sunlight for the tree to thrive.
5. You live in one of the following areas: south of Salem Street and the Mystic River, including Hillside, Glenwood, South Medford, and Wellington neighborhoods. (If you live outside of these area, you can purchase a tree at wholesale cost: \$150)

TreesMedford provides native trees of varying sizes and shapes so you can select the right tree for your yard. Best selection of trees is available if ordered by March 1, 2026!

Join over 8,100 of your neighbors in turning food waste into compost through our partnership with Garbage to Garden! Two MILLION pounds of waste have already been

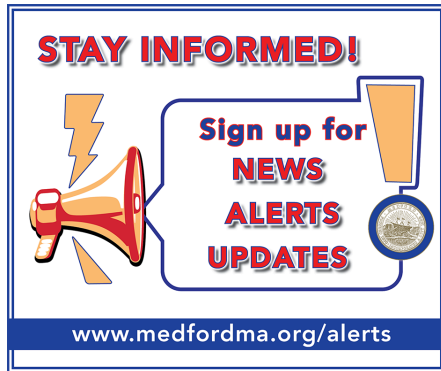




diverted from landfills since the start of this program last summer.
